If you want to know more about land development in your area go to the Placer County web pages. This is the start of your opportunity to comment on projects in the County. The local Municipal Advisory Boards will often hear project proposals at the earliest stages and again when ready to proceed to the Placer County Planning Commission and then the Board of Supervisors. Many more projects are listed here. This is large list of projects in the review process and is a good place to find out about projects early in the development process.

Folsom State Recreation Area is developing its' Road and Trail Management Plan the anticipated completion date July 2016. The webpage: http://www.parks.ca.gov/?page_id=28192

The RTMP will: identify new trail routes to be developed; make decisions regarding whether to keep and adopt, eliminate or re-align non-system (user-created) trails; prioritize maintenance needs; make recommendations on changes-in-use designations for specific trails. Change in Use requests have been filed on many trails in Folsom requesting the addition of bikes on Browns Ravine Trail and Pioneer Express Trail, among others. The RTMP will have to be completed before the Change in Use requests can be finalized.




Las Trampas Ridge Regional Wilderness

East Bay Regional Park District

Bollinger Canyon Road, west of Danville Contra Costa County, California

Introduction

Equestrians will enjoy the trails within the Las Trampas Ridge Regional Wilderness. There are rental stables where you can board your horse for overnight, a large parking lot horse trailers, and a staging area.

The city of Danville is only four miles away, with lots of amenities (motels, restaurants, supplies).

Access is by Interstate 680 from Walnut Creek, then exit on **Crow Canyon Road**, then turn northwest onto paved **Bollinger Canyon Road** (shown in blue on the regional map at left).

There is a detailed 4-page version of this report on the LBHA website.



The regional trail system connects into trails at Mount Diablo.





The cost for stabling is \$15 per night (bring your own feed); or \$20 per night with their feed supplied. It is advisable to phone ahead for reservations.

There is a wash-rack for your horse, which is convenient after a long ride in the summer and autumn. There is no lodging available at the stables. Many riders enjoy using a motel (= beds, showers, bathrooms) in Danville, only 4 miles away.
